Summary of key findings This provision meets requirements
<p>The childminder demonstrates a good understanding of the learning and development requirements for the early years' foundation stage. She discusses learning opportunities she will provide for children to support their early development. For example, reading books to extend children's imagination and vocabulary. The outside area has been recently renovated. The childminder has begun to purchase resources for this new area to allow children to develop their gross motor skills, balance and coordination. She plans to continue to work on this area. The childminder is passionate about British Values and has clear rules and boundaries for children when they attend the setting. For example, she has a zero tolerance of bullying and plans to teach children to be respectful towards each other. Children will be taught how to use manners and be kind to each other, developing early social skills to enable interactions and sharing between peers. The childminder demonstrates an excellent understanding of how to embed strong parent partnerships to enable him to work closely with parents to support children's learning. The childminder has adapted their setting to ensure it is safe for children. There are specific areas for younger and older children to ensure resources are appropriate and suitable for different aged groups. The childminder also carries out risk assessments to ensure the environment remains safe for children. For example, doors are locked, the garden area is cleared of litter and resources that older children use is put away when younger children are present. The childminder demonstrates a good understanding of safe sleeping arrangements. She provides cots and mattresses for children to sleep on and will monitor children throughout their naps. Furthermore, bedding will be washed daily to ensure good hygiene.</p> <p>Safeguarding is effective</p> <p>The Childminder has sound knowledge on all areas within Safeguarding, she understands the signs and symptoms of multiple types of abuse and where she should refer her concerns to. The Childminder also has greater understanding of wider Safeguarding concepts such as Female Genital Mutilation, Prevent Duty, Breast Ironing, and county lines, and knows the procedures to follow should any of these concerns arise. The Childminder has good policies and procedures in place to support her Safeguarding understanding. The Childminders work well together to communicate any safeguarding concerns and ensure the welfare of the children within her care is paramount.</p>



There were no children in the early years age range present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no early year's children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children.
